What do councillors do?

Councillors have three main components to their work.

- 1. Decision making Through meetings, councillors decide which activities to support, where money should be spent, what services should be delivered and what policies should be implemented.
- 2. Monitoring Councillors make sure that their decisions lead to efficient and effective services by keeping an eye on how well things are working.
- 3. Getting involved locally As local representatives, councillors have responsibilities towards their constituents and local organisations. These responsibilities and duties often depend on what the councillor wants to achieve and how much time is available.

How much time does it take up?

We meet monthly with the meetings generally being up to two hours long. Some councillors spend additional time each month with other activities around the village and progressing projects with the clerk. In the main, being a parish councillor is an enjoyable way of contributing to your community and helping to make it a better place to live and work.
