Farningham Parish Council met in the Shand Hall at St Peter and St Paul's Church on Wednesday, 12th February 2025, and present were five Parish Councillors, Kent County Councillor Roger Gough, Sevenoaks District Councillor Alan White, two members of the public and the Clerk Helen Penney.

Parish Vacancies:

We remain very keen to recruit two more Parish Councillors from our community. It is not an onerous job and can be very rewarding. Please contact our Clerk or any current Councillor for further details.

Annual Parish Meeting:

Don't forget to come along to the Village Hall at 6.30pm on Friday, 28th March. Parish Councillors, Kent County Councillor Roger Gough and PC Caleb Guest are expected be among those attending and they will be taking questions from the floor. It is an informal meeting with refreshments.

Highways:

Cllr Gough said new signs indicating No Right Turn at the junction of the A225 and A20 will be in place shortly and, since the meeting, have been installed. Telematic data can be taken and if illegal turns continue enforcement action will be an option. Councillors are meeting a KCC Highways Engineer in March and one of the issues to be raised is the increased speeds being recorded on the A20 between Kings Roundabout and the Open Road sign at London Road.

Local Government reorganisation:

Cllr Gough conveyed his deep disappointment at the Government's decision to exclude Kent and Medway from the first round of devolving council authorities. It is currently expected that Kent will have Unitary Authorities by April 2028.

Community Police Officer:

PC Caleb Guest has returned to his duties as our Community Officer and has indicated that he will be at our annual Parish Meeting on March 28th as well as our next Farningham Parish Council meeting on 9th April. Recently released Kent Police statistics indicate that while the crime rate is dropping incidents of anti-social behaviour are rising in our Ward.

Kent Police are encouraging anyone with home security or a camera doorbell to sign up to the CCTV Registry to help keep the community safe. It's free, secure, quick to register and your camera footage could be used to support investigations to help bring criminals to justice.
